

## A Match Made at Tel Hai Camp by Gregg Horst



So many of you have followed the progress of our Cabin Challenge as it has progressed over the past 5 years. We started with a goal of \$300,000 that we needed to raise in order to pay off the mortgage on these cabins. These cabins have been such a tremendous blessing to the camp ministry and we continue to hear rave reviews from those who make use of them each weekend throughout the year and all through the summer.

One family dedicated themselves to meeting the cost of one entire cabin, and they met this goal. Over these past years, many friends have contributed generously toward closing out the mortgage, and this past year some dear friends who love the Tel Hai ministry, put forth a matching challenge to eliminate this debt. The "Coins for Cabins" project was also a part of this matching endeavor. We came within just a little more than \$14,000 of meeting the full mortgage elimination. PRAISE THE LORD, and THANK YOU for your part!

#### This brought us to a new hurdle and a new challenge.



We have turned now from this project and found ourselves faced with another urgent need. The camp board moved to approve and act immediately on some critical and necessary capital

improvements. This winter we moved forward with a huge renovation of the Pine and Elm dormitories.

These cabins were showing their age badly and one had significant insect damage which required repair. They were gutted back to the studs and rebuilt. They look like new cabins inside with new bunks and a brightness and



freshness that is welcoming. Outside, the new decks and new roofing has brought them to a condition of effectively being new cabins. With this in mind, we have renamed them. Elm is now called Bethel, Dogwood is now called Berea, and Pine A & B have had their main entrances changed to give a feel of being separate cabins. Pine A is now called Goshen and Pine B is Jaffa. They have been met with great "reviews" by the campers and groups that have used them.



This undertaking, combined with the restoration of our gym roof (that was leaking terribly), completing the installation of our backup generator (that has been waiting patiently in the cold for "attention"), and a

few other urgent projects, left us with an estimated cost of

We were able to work with Eastern Mennonite to take out additional funds on the same mortgage at even better terms and move forward on these projects which have been called the "CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT".

As I mention in the title "A Match Made at Tel Hai Camp," it was not referring to just the match for the Cabin Challenge, but this same family has offered an anonymous matching challenge for the Capital Improvement Project.

After prayerful consideration of the camp's needs, they have made the following matching pledge:

- Up to \$20,000 match in 2015, to match donations made during 2015
- Up to \$20,000 match in 2016, to match donations made during 2016
- Up to \$20,000 match in 2017, to match donations made during 2017

They are also willing to accelerate the match if donations exceed the \$20,000 in 2015 and 2016 with a goal of reducing our debt even faster. The end target is to enable us to eliminate the \$120,000 of debt by the end of 2017.

The marker has been set! **Will you help us?** We are past 25% so far on the 2015 target, but that still leaves plenty of opportunity. **Will you join us?** Will you help us reach these goals that have been set in our pursuit of making Tel Hai Camp "that special place where people can meet with God and God can meet with people"?
