My camp days started as a young child in Michigan. I remember going to a Christian children's camp as a third grader. I was terrified and missed my parents tremendously. Luckily, my brother was in my cabin and helped to keep me focused on the next event.

As a middle school and high school student I attended a Christian camp in Indiana. As a pastor's kid, I was thinking that this whole "church thing" was just for old people. I can still remember going to the first night service and being blown away as I saw teenagers my age pursuing Jesus Christ with all that they had. Year after year I attend this camp, and it was here that I felt God begin to call me to full-time ministry.

Fast-forward many, many years later... I took a job as a Youth Pastor at Immanuel Church in Wilmington, Delaware seven years ago. All that the youth in my youth group would talk about was "camp." If there was a moment where they felt the closest to God, it was at camp. If there was a funny story to tell, it was about camp. Camp was the #1 thing that I knew I had to continue as the new incoming Youth Pastor.

I did have an "in" with this youth camp. I happened to marry the only daughter of Michael 'Guerty' Guertin, the Pastoral Director of Hopewell Summer Camps who run their camps out of Tel Hai.

My first summer as the Youth Pastor, I knew I had to be there to experience some of it for myself. I remember being asked by my father-in-law to preach opening night of Teen Camp. I was honored, and did not really know what to expect. Obviously, I knew we had a huge God that could do anything, but I was still shocked. After speaking, dozens of teens flooded the stage to lay on their teenager to camp. We know that if we can get them faces before the Lord. This camp was changing lives, and I knew it didn't have anything to do with me! After a turn of unfortunate events for one of the camp directors, I stuck around a few more days to help out in any way that mouths is so encouraging. I could.

BETWEEN the LINES

As I am passing the 20 year mark of being on staff at Tel Hai Camp, I have been reflecting on God's goodness and how much He has taught me through my years of camping ministry. Including my years at another camp, I have been serving in camping ministry for 31 years now. My brother says I am a

"lifer". At Tel Hai we say that camp is a place where "People can meet with God, and God can meet with people." Though I received Christ at the age of 5, God met with me and spoke to me at camp 31 years ago, and the rest as they say is history.

While I have learned much over the years, what I have learned the most is that God is faithful. He is faithful even when we are not. He is faithful to His character, faithful to His promises, and faithful to His work in our lives. One of the ways He has shown His faithfulness is in how He provides for our needs. Ephesians 3:20 says that He "is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us." I have seen God provide over and over in my years of camp.

One summer I was short staffed and had no lifeguards or staff director. I had to fill these roles myself. The Friday before the start of camp, I was worried about how everything would work out. Fifteen minutes before our Dedication Dinner I got a call from someone who could help out the

first week. Every week was the same, I would find out on Sunday who God was providing that week. I learned to stop worrying and just wait on the Lord to see how He would provide.

Years earlier I learned another lesson in how we don't always understand God's ways and how He knows what is best. One of my first years as a counselor at another camp, I was excited about working with the campers, but one very hot, humid week I had to do maintenance. That week I helped build a staff quarters above their dining hall, putting up fiberglass insulation and drywall. I was miserable and couldn't understand why God would have me doing this instead of working with kids. Fast forward about 7 years. I was working full time at camp, had little money, and had to vacate the house I was living in because my roommate was getting married. I was worried about being homeless. Well, ended up living in the very staff quarters that I had helped build all those years ago. God is faithful and knows our needs way before we even know them.

Tel Hai Camp has some large needs at this time. I know God will provide. Just maybe God wants to use you to make that provision happen. And just maybe your children or grandchildren will someday use the very thing that you helped to support. God knows. God is faithful.
