Looking Back, Moving Forward

As I write this, I am sitting on the front porch of House 35 at Tel Hai Camp with about two and a half days left in my ninth summer on summer staff. Over my nine years I have grown a lot and my life has

changed drastically. Now that this summer is coming to a close, I am starting to become nostalgic about my time here as a summer staffer. However, looking back on it, my ministry here started long before I even joined the summer staff. It started as a little kid.

My family has been involved with Tel Hai Camp for a few generations. My parents instilled in me and my sisters from a young age that serving others is one of the most important things in life. Tel Hai was a great place to put that into action as a family. We started helping in the kitchen as little kids and grew to love the camp and the relationships we made.

I decided to attend camp here at Tel Hai as a camper with Adventure Camp. I can vividly remember sitting in the chapel praising God in our worship sessions and thinking, "Man, this is GREAT!" There was something very real and very close to God about being in an outdoor chapel with 100 other kids my age jamming out to "Grin Again Gang" for God. That is one of my first

memories of Tel Hai Camp. Three years later I was *finally* old enough to work at camp as summer staff in the kitchen! God sure knows what He's doing because it couldn't have come at a better time in my life. I was really struggling

with my faith before I came to work here. That first summer transformed my life in ways I could never have anticipated. It was here at camp that summer that I made my faith my own and re-dedicated my life to the Lord. It was a night-and-day difference between the beginning and end of that sum-

mer. God is good.

Now, looking back on nine years as a staff member, I see how much things have changed. I started here after my freshman year of high school. I have since moved from being a kitchen "slave," to a lifeguard and boating instructor, to an instructor for the challenge course, zip line, and climbing wall, then on to Bruce's "lackey" as Staff Director. Since starting here, I graduated from high school, got married, and graduated from college this past spring. (Yes, for you math wizards, it took five years for college. Some of us just enjoy it that much!) I have now spent the last 15 months living at camp full-time with my beautiful wife Jamie (whom I met at camp).

At the closing of this summer, it is bittersweet for me and Jamie. We are excited about all the positive things that happened at camp this summer. We know that many kids have come to know Christ here over the years, including my baby sister, who is now on summer staff. We also believe that we have had a big impact on the summer staff that we have worked with. However, we are also sad that this will be our last summer serving Tel Hai in this capacity. God has called us to move on for my continuing education in Upstate New York. While we are excited about the upcoming adventures, we are both sad to be closing the curtain on this stage of our lives. Tel Hai has meant so much to both of us and we have poured ourselves into this ministry for so long that we both truly feel that the camp is a large part of who we are. We hope to be involved with the camp in the future in different capacities when we return to the area, but for now, we are content to continue on as prayer warriors for the camp. We both know first hand the impact that this wonderful ministry has. We also would like to thank you all for your continued support of the camp and the staff as they pour their lives into this

- Large air compressor, large rolling tool box.


